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2013 Fall Cleanup to be held September 30 – October 11

The Public Works Department will be conducting the annual Fall Cleanup Sept. 30 through Oct. 11. This free pick up service is for residential areas only; it is not for businesses.

To accommodate the needs of both the homeowner and City collection crews, the City has been divided into eight collection areas. On the accompanying map, each area is numbered to correspond with the calendar day on which the pick-up will occur.

*Sept. 30: North of Kansas Ave. to south of Mary St. between Fleming St. and Bypass, and north of Mary St. to north city limits between Main St. and Bypass.

*Oct. 1: North of drainage ditch to north city limits between Hager Addition and Main St.

*Oct. 2: North of Kansas Ave. to south of Mary St. between Main St. and Fleming St.

*Oct. 3: North of Kansas Ave. to drainage ditch between Taylor Ave. and Main St.

*Oct. 7: South city limits to Fulton St. between Taylor Ave and Center St.; south city limits to Kansas Ave. between Center St. and Jennie Barker Rd., and Prairie Wind Subdivision.

*Oct. 8: North of Fulton St. to south of Kansas Ave. between Main St. and Center St.

*Oct. 9: North of Fulton St. to south of Kansas Ave. between Taylor Ave. and Main St.

*Oct. 10: North of Fulton St. to south of Campbell St. between west city limits and Taylor Ave.

*Oct 4. and Oct. 11 will be used as general collection days giving coverage to those areas that may not have been completed during scheduled collection days. For those individuals who may have been missed during their regular collection day, please call 276-1270 before Thursday, October 10th to make arrangements to have your items collected.

The City of Garden City Public Works Department is coordinating the program. Because of landfill regulations, the City asks homeowners to separate tree

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trimmings, (no longer than eight feet) into one pile, old furniture and boxes into another, and old appliances into another. If a City truck has gone by an area and picked up some items, but not all them, it does not mean the City is finished in the area. Each truck is designated to pick up certain items i.e. appliances, tree limbs, miscellaneous items.

Please note the following rules and regulations:

*Appliances with refrigerants (refrigerators & air conditioners) will not be collected unless the unit has been decharged – the Street Department does not have the capability to decharge them. A copy of the certification must be attached to each unit. City crews will leave notices on any appliances that do not have the certification attached to them. Citizens may call 276-1270 any day during the 2013 Fall Clean-Up, to make arrangements to have appliances picked up once they are decharged. Special care should be taken to ensure that old refrigerators and similar appliances are child proofed (remove the doors or tie them shut) to prevent the chances of serious mishap.

*All tires and rim removals will be charged back to the address they were collected from.

*Shingles or roofing materials will not be accepted.

*No vehicle motors, batteries, liquid paints, hazardous waste materials, or any petroleum products will be accepted. Grass clippings and leaves will not be picked up.

*Any waste by a contractor for tree trimming, home remodeling, appliances, etc. will not be accepted. The contractor is responsible for the removal service.

*Large quantities of concrete, bricks and sod will not be accepted.

*If you would like to participate in the 2013 Fall Clean-Up, please carry all items you want picked up to the street curb the day before your scheduled pick-up. Items left in the alley or by the garage will not be picked up.



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
